








# Estimated domestic migration (2000-2008) by county as a percentage of 2000 population



# Estimated international migration (2000-2008) by county as a percentage of 2000 population








# Percent of Total Population that are Non-Citizens in Texas Counties, 2005-2009






# Texas Racial and Ethnic Composition, 2000 and 2010





# Percent of the Population that is non-Hispanic Anglo and Hispanic by County, 2010









# Total Population by County, 2010






# Change of the Total Population by County, 2000 to 2010




# Percent Change of Total Population in Texas Counties, 2000-2010





# Projected population by county, Texas, 2040



# Percent Projected Change of Total Population in Texas Counties, 2008-2040




# Percent of People Below Poverty in the Past 12 Months (for whom poverty status is determined)




# Percent of People 25 Years and Over Who Have Completed High School (includes equivalency)




# Percent of People 25 Years and Over Who Have Completed a Bachelor's Degree




# Physicians per 1,000 Population, 2010



# Change in Physicians per 1,000 Population, 2010-2000




# Percent of the Civilian Labor Force Employed in Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting, Texas Counties, 2005-2009





## Number of Farms with Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino Origin Operators: 2007




# Number of Farms with Black or African American Operators: 2007









# Percent of Principal Farm Operators Not Residing on Farm Operated: 2007



# Percent of Farms Operated by Family or Individual: 2007







## Average Age of Principal Farm Operators: 2007
