





Total Population by County, 2010






Change of the Total Population by County, 2000 to 2010













Percent of the Population that is non-Hispanic Anglo and Hispanic by County, 2010







Non-Hispanic Anglo Population by County, 2010






Hispanic Population by County, 2010






Non-Hispanic Black Population by County, 2010







Non-Hispanic Asian Population by County, 2010



Projected Texas Population Pyramid by Race/Ethnicity, 2010




Projected Population Growth in Texas, 2000-2040




Projected Racial and Ethnic Percent, Texas, 2000-2040




Median Housing Unit Age by County, 2005-2009





Percent of Housing Units that are Vacant, 2005-2009







Percent of the population 5 and over who speak Spanish at home, 2005-2009



Percent of Households that are Linguistically Isolated, by County, 2005-2009





Median Household Income by County, 2005-2009

Percent of Children Less than 18 Years of Age in Poverty During the Past 12 Months by County, 2005-2009







