





# Percent of Migrants to Texas between 2000 and 2009 by Race and Ethnicity




# Texas Racial and Ethnic Composition, 2000 and 2010








# Texas White (non-Hispanic) and Hispanic Populations by Age, 2010









# Total Population by County, 2010





# Percent Change of Total Population in Texas Counties, 2000-2010



Population increase for Texas was 20.6% during this period



# Mean Travel Time to Work, Texas Census Tracts, 2006-2010

## Mean travel time






# Percent Labor Force Employed in Professional, Scientific, Management Occupations, Texas Census Tracts, 2006-2010






# Percent Households Receiving SNAP Benefits, Texas Census Tracts, 2006-2010





# Percent of the Labor Force Unemployed, Texas Census Tracts, 2006-2010




# Projected Population Growth in Texas, 2000-2040
